## Pastor=s Column

In June I preached about the importance of sharing our faith stories with others. People need to know about Jesus Christ. He is an awesome savior and he gives us hope in times that sometimes seem pretty dark and hopeless. In that sermon I gave 10 suggestions of ways you can share your faith with others, from least scary to most scary. Several people have asked for this list, so here it is. Maybe it will inspire you to come up with your own ways of sharing your faith with those around you.

10. Tell someone you know something that happened at church on Sunday. Talk about what was meaningful, stood out, or has kept you thinking.

9. Ask someone you know if you can pray for them. If someone tells you something hard going on in their life, ask if you can add them to your prayer list. Better yet, ask if you can pray for them right then and there.

8. Pray for a stranger. Ask the waitress who brings your food if she has anything she would like you to pray for. Ask a neighbor if you can include them in your prayers. If you see someone struggling with a door or with kids or with groceries, help them and then say that you will pray for them.

7. Pray for yourself, that God will give you opportunities and courage to share your faith.

6. Take God up on the opportunities he gives you. Look for ways to insert God into your daily conversations. Talking about your faith should come as naturally as talking about your kids or your health.
5. Teach your children about God. Read them Bible stories. Pray with them. Let them know you love Jesus and you think it is important for them to love him too.
4. Invite someone to take advantage of the non-religious stuff offered at church. Invite them to the Trash and Treasure Sale, Spaghetti Dinner, Vacation Bible School, Camp Fun and Sun. Tell them about Angel Food, Open Gym, the School Supply Give-Away.
3. Invite someone to worship with you on Sunday morning. Bring them to church. Sit with them. Introduce them to others.
2. Tell someone about something wonderful God has done in your life. You can practice this ahead of time so you have a story ready when God gives you an opportunity to share.
1. Tell someone about Jesus - who he is, why you believe in him, and what it means to say he is your savior.

We need to be bolder about using the opportunities God gives us to share our faith. Trusting and relying on God gives us life, joy, and peace. Others need to know that God loves them and will always be there for them. *You shall be my witnesses - in the town where you live, in your state, in your country, and even to the remotest parts*

*of the earth.* (Acts 1:8b, my paraphrase)

How to Sing a Praise Song  
from *The Unofficial United Methodist Handbook*

Many United Methodist congregations have services in the style often called Praise and Worship, featuring guitars and drums. In these settings the words are typically displayed on large projections screens.

1. **Follow the instructions of the song leader.** Someone in the praise band will invite the congregation to stand up, sit down, repeat certain sections, or divide into men=s and women=s vocal parts. Pay attention to this person to avoid getting off track.
2. **Learn the melody and song structure.** Pay special attention to the melody line sung by the band=s lead vocalist.
3. **Sing along with gusto.** Once the melody has been introduced, join in the singing. When you=re comfortable with the song, experiment with harmony parts.
4. **Avoid Azoning out.** Singing lyrics that are projected onto screens can result in a glazed-over facial expression similar to watching television. Avoid this by surveying the worship area, noticing symbols, and making eye contact with other people.
5. **Identify lyrical themes.** Determine if the song is being used as a confession, a prayer, a hymn of praise, or serves another purpose.
6. **Watch out for raised hands.** Some United Methodists emote while singing contemporary Christian songs and may suddenly raise their hands in praise to God. Be sure to give these worshipers plenty of room to avoid losing your eyeglasses.
7. **United Methodist worship is highly participatory.** The praise band is there to help you and the congregation to sing and participate in worship, not to perform a concert.
8. **There are not strict prohibitions in the United Methodist tradition against physical expression during worship.** In fact, in the earliest days of the movement, outsiders thought the services a bit too exuberant and the acts of worship just a bit too lively.
