## Pastor=s Column

EXCUSES! I hate excuses. I don=t like it when people give me reasons why they couldn=t do something they said they would do. And I don=t like to make excuses myself. One of my favorite Star Wars lines is Yoda=s ADo or do not. There is no try.@ Jesus said something similar, ALet your answer be yes or no, anything beyond that is evil.@ (Matthew 5:37).

What excuses are you making for not attending church? What excuses are you making for not having a regular prayer time or reading the Bible every day? What excuses are you making for watching tv or playing games on the computer instead of interacting with your family? Where are you letting excuses get in the way of doing what God wants you to do?

As a church we sometimes fall back on excuses. The worst one is Awe=ve always done it this way@ or its converse Awe=ve never done it that way.@ I hate those excuses. So what? If we keep doing things exactly as we always have been, we will get the same result we always have. Sometimes I like to shake things up just to see what rises to the top - or bottom. We also use the excuse of not enough money or not enough volunteers. How many things have we not done for the Kingdom of God because of these excuses?

I believe that if God wants it done, there is nothing that can stand in our way. People may throw up flack, resources may be tight, there may only be a few dedicated people willing to work on it. But I don=t want to stand in front of God someday and offer up excuses. As a church, and as an individual following Christ, I want to be able to tell him that I did everything I could for his Kingdom. And I never

want to make excuses for not following him or not doing things his way.

How is Jesus knocking on your door? How is God calling you to change?

Where do we need to let go of our excuses and be about the business of the Kingdom of God? God is calling us to a future that is beyond what we can even imagine. In order to get there we have to let go of the things that hold us back - like our excuses.

### **What=s Good at Wedgewood**

On Saturday, May 1, 16 people from Wedgewood went up to Redeemer UMC in North Hill to work. Redeemer was built in 1919 and is a beautiful old church in the Akron Plan style. Although the church once had almost 800 members, it now has about 60 with an average attendance of 20, most of them over 70. So the church has fallen into some disrepair and doesn=t have younger people to help. Julie and Mark Verrona looked over the jobs that needed to be done and recruited people from Wedgewood to get them done.

People from Wedgewood, Woodland, Redeemer and Hudson met on that day to do some sprucing up of the church. We painted the pillars, doors, and the cross at the front of the church. We weeded and tore down vines that had grown over fences and started up the church walls. We picked up trash. We cleaned the gorgeous woodwork in the sanctuary and mopped floors and stairs. We installed drop down steps for attic access, eliminating the need for a rickety ladder that went up over a 30 foot stairwell.

People from the neighborhood stopped by to chat. Many of them thought the church had been abandoned and were glad to see people working at the church. All of them received an invitation to attend worship or share in the free lunches on Fridays. Those of us who worked felt good about what we were doing together. We

were able to make a difference for the people of that church and that neighborhood.

## **How to Sing a Hymn** *from **AThe Unofficial United Methodist Handbook***

Hymn singing is a powerful United Methodist tradition. Part of the family has been known as *Asinging Methodists* and some have said United Methodists learn and express the theology most often by what they sing. One of the founders of the movement, Charles Wesley (1707-1788) wrote over 6,000 hymns. His brother John Wesley (1703-1791) gave directions for singing that still appear in the *The United Methodist Hymnal*, including the advice *Aabove all sing spiritually. Have an eye on God in every word you sing.*

1. **Locate hymns in advance.** As you prepare for worship, consult the worship bulletin or the hymn board to find numbers for the day's hymns. Bookmark these pages in the hymnal using an offering envelope, attendance card, or the wrapper from a previously dispatched stick of chewing gum. Do not use the chewing gum itself.
2. **Familiarize yourself with the hymns.** The hymnal contains a ton of information about the hymns. Find the credits for author - words, and composer - music (usually at the bottom of the hymn). When was it written? The tune has a name of its own which is printed with the hymn. Many hymnals group hymns by category; the category might be theological or seasonal or topical.
3. **Figure out those mystery numbers.** See if the hymn has a series of numbers at the bottom of the page. For example, you might see 11.11.11.5 or 77.77. Make some guesses as to what these numbers might be: shoe size of composer or score of the game when the hymn was written. In truth, these numbers count the meter, number of syllables, in each phrase of the hymn. You can move a hymn text from one tune to another with the same meter.
4. **Assist nearby visitors or children.** Using a hymnal can be confusing. If

your neighbor seems disoriented, help them find the correct page, or let them read from your book.

5. **Adopt a posture for best vocal performance.** Hold the hymnal away from your body at chest level. Place one hand under the spine of the binding, leaving the other hand free to turn the pages. Keep your chin up so your voice projects outward.
6. **Begin singing.** If the hymn is unfamiliar, sing the melody for the first verse. Loud-singing neighbors may or may not be in tune, so follow them with caution.
7. **Focus on the hymn=s content.** Some of the lyrics may connect with a scripture reading of the day. Certain ones may be especially inspiring.
8. **Avoid dreariness.** Hymns are sometimes sung in such a serious way that the congregation forgets to enjoy the music. Sing with energy and feeling.

### *Lay Speaking Ministries B Basic Course*

August 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and September 18<sup>th</sup>

or

October 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 16

*(The same course is offered two different time. You should register for only one session.)*

This is the foundation course for Lay Speakers and it offers a broad understanding of the many facets of Lay Speaking Ministries with a focus on caring, communicating, and leadership. Participants will learn about servant leadership and how to develop skills for leadership roles within the local church.

Individuals are encouraged to recognize their own spiritual gifts in order to use them as God intended.

Church Lay Leaders, as well as other active laity, are encouraged to take this course because it offers guidelines for best practices as a church leader and outlines a number of ministries in which Lay Speakers may assume roles. Those who complete the course are then eligible to be recognized as a Local Lay Speaker. This newly revised basic course may also be taken by Certified Lay Speakers to meet the three-year course requirement for renewal.
